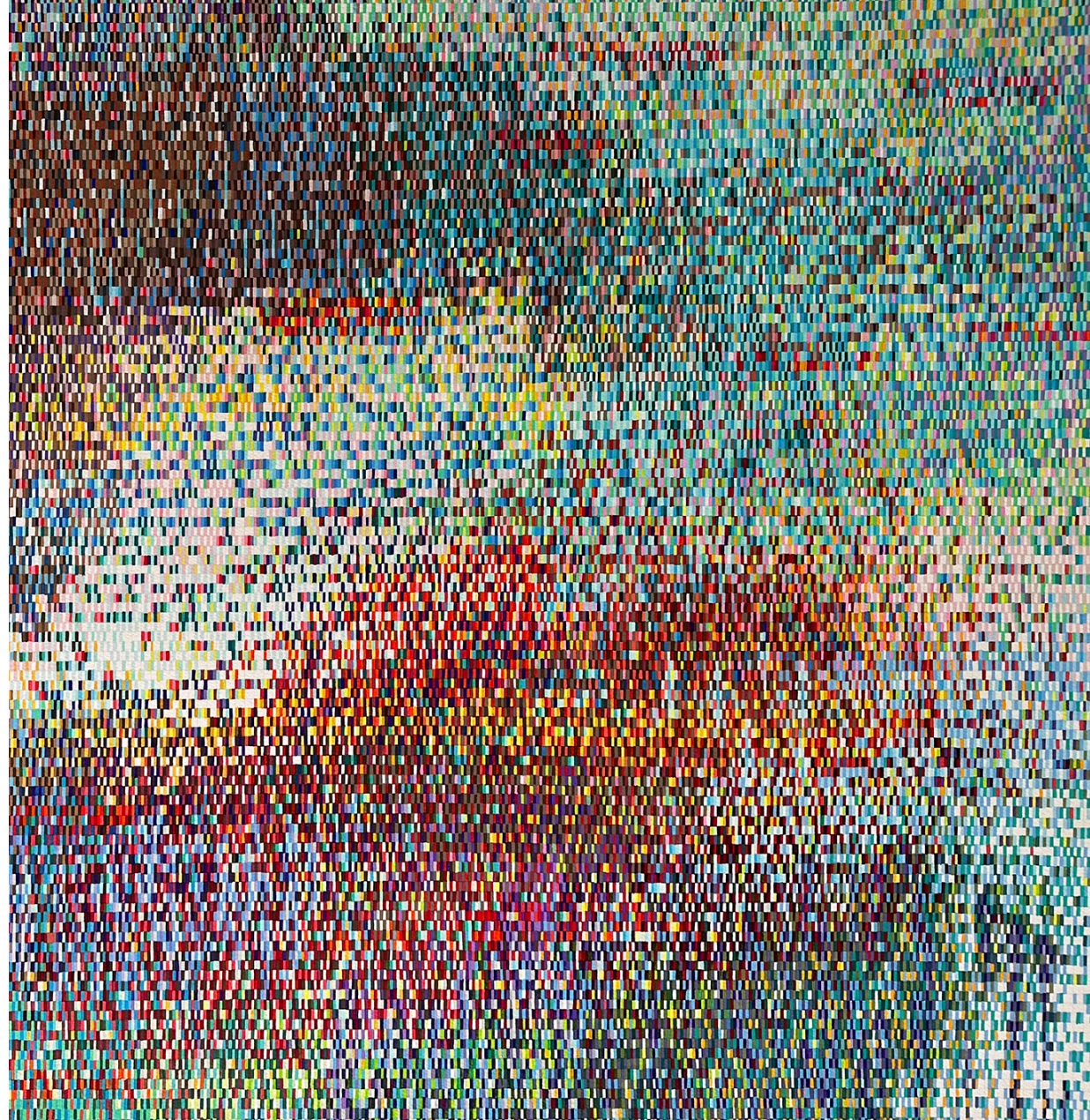

TINY RECTANGLES, MONUMENTAL REMEMBRANCE

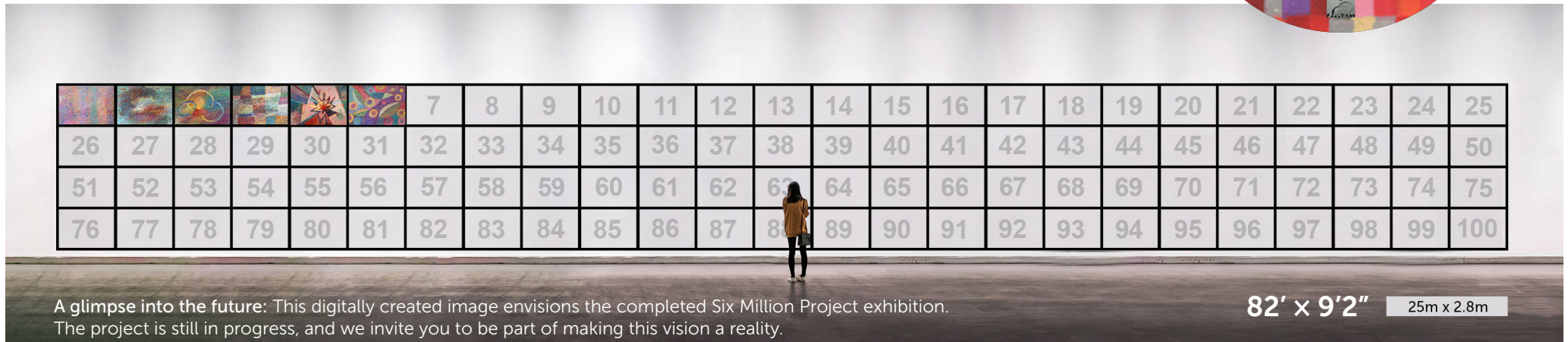

Can you imagine Six Million?

The Six Million Project is a community art initiative honoring Holocaust victims and confronting antisemitism today.

The project will consist of one hundred paintings — each made up of sixty thousand tiny rectangles. Every rectangle represents a Jewish life stolen in the Holocaust, hand-painted as a personal act of remembrance. Together, they form a powerful warning of how far unchecked hatred can go.



Why it matters now

Antisemitism hasn't disappeared — it has changed form.

From outright hatred to anti-Israel distortion, today's antisemitism wears new masks. The Six Million Project is a powerful visual reminder of the cost of silence and the importance of action.

"As the daughter of a Holocaust survivor, I've always felt a great sensitivity to antisemitism — even back in the day when it seemed like a thing of the past."

The project began at Liora's home studio in Israel in 2022, dedicated to honoring the six million Jewish lives lost in the Holocaust.

The Six Million Project is a collaborative effort that invites people to honor Holocaust memory by hand-painting six million rectangles. By coloring each rectangle individually, we connect to the individual humanity within this vast number.

"I believe that the project could serve as a potent instrument of empathy in addressing the rising global tide of antisemitism and combatting Holocaust denial," says Liora.

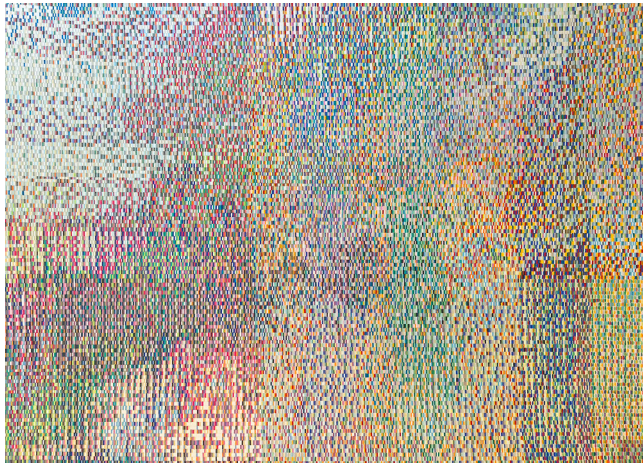
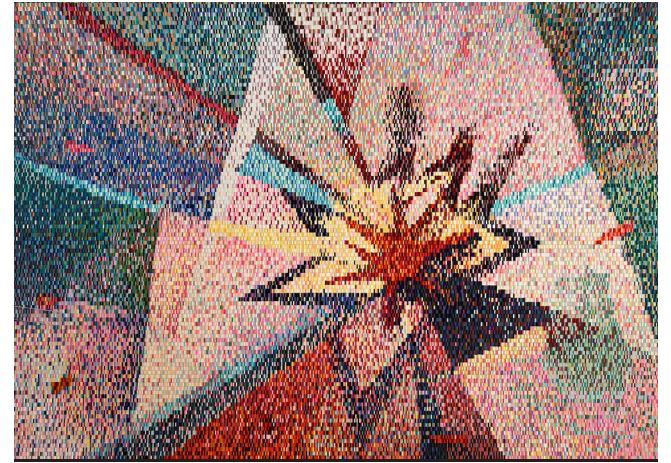


Panels

Each panel measures 1m x 70cm
and contains 60,000 rectangles.

Panel Size:
1 meter x 70 cm
(39.4" x 27.6")

Rectangle size:
6mm x 2mm
(0.24" x 0.08")



Togetherness

Coloring each rectangle and reflecting on its significance has had a deeply personal impact for participants, creating a profound connection to the memory it honors.

Since October 7, this project has offered participants in Israel and abroad a sense of comfort, togetherness, and strength, especially during this difficult time.

Many find a deep sense of healing and unity through these events.

"This project could unite us Jews of the world as we show the world that we are more than just a number. We rise and come together through the emptiness and darkness, just like light."

2024/5 Timeline

The Six Million Project has already gained considerable recognition, with an invitation to host workshops at JW3, London's main Jewish community center, in 2025.

May
Yom HaShoah marathon held with Telfed with over 100 participants. *Zikaron BaSalon* painting session at Liora Blum's home in Israel.

June
First international group began in *Vancouver*, Canda. Meetings held once a week, ongoing.

July
Public social media campaign launched to attract more painters, with a focus on creating dynamic and emotional content about the project.

August
Events held at Liora's home in Raanana. Participants engaged in painting and informal discussions about antisemitism and Jewish heritage.

September
First event held at Emunah Ladies Beit Midrash, *Johannesburg*.

October
Painting event at Umhlanga Jewish Centre, *Durban*, South Africa. Sukkot-themed event for women.

November:
Regular painting sessions continued at Liora's home, fostering community and reflection on the global rise of antisemitism.

December
Painting events at MacDonalds International Shul (*Netanya*) and an event sponsored by the *Rishon LeZion* municipality.

January
Workshop at Kehilat Lev *Raanana* Shul, Batmitzvah girls and their mothers.

March
Zoom interview with *Colorado Jewish Genealogical society*.

April 21
Painting workshop at Kehilat Ahavat Tzion, Ramat Beit Shemesh to commemorate *Yom HaShoah*.

April 22
Ra'anana Municipality painting event to commemorate *Yom HaShoah*.

April 24
Painting workshop at Telfed, Raanana to commemorate *Yom HaShoah*.

Travel to Jewish centers worldwide for **painting workshops** with space for reflection, Israeli vibes and togetherness.
